The Ministry of Home Affairs etc., are therefore, requested to ensure that particular care is taken to avoid commitments which require the prior concurrence of the Ministry of Finance, without obtaining such concurrence in advance.

Copy of Office Memorandum No.F.11(42)-Est.III/48 dated the 4th November, 1948, addressed to all Ministries of the Government of India etc.

Cases have recently occurred in which certain officers serving under Provincial Governments, and others not in Government service, were offered terms for appointment under the Central Government without these terms having been approved by the Ministry of Finance. This position is nighly irregular and also prejudicial to a proper examination of the matter by the Ministry of Finance. It is extremely desirable that previous financial sanction should be obtained before commitments involving financial liability are entered into by Ministeries. If any such commitment is made without such concurrence, the Ministry of Finance is not bound to honour it, as a matter of course.
